State Representative Jerry Sonnenberg of Sterling will travel to each end of his district and listen to constituents Thursday, Feb. 26. His tour will start in Sterling at the Sterling Ramada Inn, east of Sterling on Highway 6. He will be there from 7:30-8:30 a.m. Sonnenberg then will join Andy Rice on KPMX Radio, 105.7 FM as part of the Morning Circus.

The tour then heads to the eastern edge of his district for a town hall meeting at the Pizza p.a.d., located at 110 N. Interocean in Holyoke. Sonnenberg is scheduled to listen to concerns from 10:30-11:30 a.m.

From Phillips County, he heads to the southwest corner of House District 65 where he will meet constituents at the Branding Iron Restaurant at 11 First Street in Fort Lupton from 3-4 p.m.
