

Rules governing oil and gas activity see changes in Colorado

Sunday, Feb. 23, Colorado's Air Quality Control Commission approved comprehensive changes to rules governing oil and gas activities in the state, including the nation's first-ever regulations designed to detect and reduce methane emissions.

The ruling concluded a public hearing that began Wednesday, Feb. 19 at the Aurora Municipal Center. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's Air Pollution Control Division initiated a robust stakeholder process more than a year ago to consider rule revisions. Industry, environmental groups and state and local governments participated.

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
