Chase County took a 2-0 lead to start Tuesday's softball action, but HHS came back to end the inning on top 3-2. After two innings, the visiting Longhorns held a 6-4 advantage.

Chase County added another run in the fourth before the Dragons let loose in the bottom of the fifth, scoring eight runs for a 12-7 lead. The visitors put one more on the board in the seventh, but Holyoke claimed the 12-8 win.
