—Adults 19-44 age division, female: Nicole Brandt, first, 54:36.

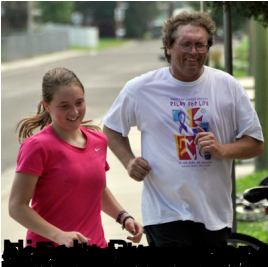
—Seniors 45-54 age division, male: Wade Warren, first, 45:00; and Jerry Brandt, second, 58:29.
