

Boys' basketball splits week's road games

Dragon boys' basketball players emerged from last week's set of league matches with a 1-1 record, falling to Yuma Tuesday, Jan. 21 and knocking off Wiggins Friday, Jan. 24.

Coach Scott Dille noted that the Dragons are at their best when they are playing aggressively, attacking the basket and moving the ball off of dribble penetration. Yuma did a good job of disrupting the HHS offense by limiting open looks as they took away passing lanes.

Defenses shined in the match and Dille praised his team's effort in the game.

"The guys came out hard, focused and knew what they had to do," Dille said. "I thought our defense was unbelievable."

The sharpshooting Yuma team continued to sink shots, mainly midrange shots, from the field in the second quarter. With five seconds left in the half, the Indians hit one of their four first-half 3s to extend their lead to 29-23.
