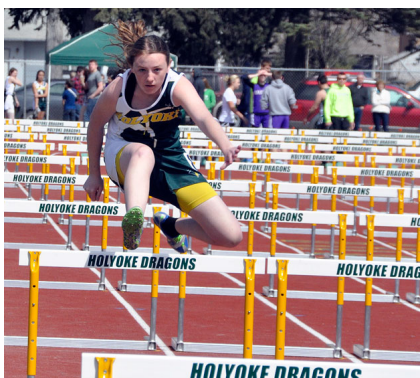


Dragons break in new track with 13 top-3 finishes

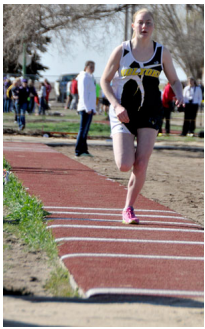
