

## Roaring '20s announced as 2013 Legacy Event theme

Enthusiasm begins anew as the Melissa Memorial Hospital Foundation (MMHF) Legacy Event committee announces “Roaring '20s” as the theme for the Feb. 23, 2013 third annual event.

Building on the success of the 2011 Mardi Gras theme and last February’s Western Splendor event, the committee anticipates another fun evening of support for the local hospital.

The Legacy Event in February has become the MMHF Foundation’s major fundraiser of the year. Instead of hosting multiple smaller events, the Foundation has rolled all into one evening of food, fun and good times.

Last year’s event was highly successful, raising close to \$50,000. A majority of the funds went to the hospital’s Grow Our Own Physician initiative, while some also was contributed for the telemetry monitoring equipment for the hospital prep and recovery room, the scholarship fund and endowment fund.

The equipment allows monitoring of patients and their vital signs before and after surgery or other outpatient procedures and any time the patient is exposed to anesthesia.

Funds from the 2013 event, scheduled for Saturday, Feb. 23 at the Phillips County Event Center, will go toward the Grow Our Own Physician initiative and equipment for the hospital.

All funds raised by the Foundation are for the benefit of Melissa Memorial Hospital.

Each year, more and more people dress the part of the Legacy Event designated theme, adding to the evening’s fun.

Co-chairs Steve and Kim Young encourage attendees to dress the Roaring '20s theme. They look forward to seeing gangsters, flappers and other imaginative costume roles from the 1920s.
